Rick holds a Professional Director Certification (Level IV/Executive) with the American College of Corporate Directors - a public company director education and credentialing organization. He has completed several director and financial management programs at Harvard, Wharton, and other prominent business schools.

From 2005 to 2018, Rick was a Senior Fellow at the Logistics Management Institute, a strategic consulting firm that serves the federal government. From 2005 to 2010, he was a director with Stanley, Inc., a publicly-held information technology company sold to CGI Group, Inc. He served on the audit and compensation committees. From 2006 to 2019, Rick was a director with Cascade Designs, Inc., a Seattle-based international outdoor equipment manufacturing and services company. He chaired the audit and finance and nominating and governance committees.

Rick was a member of the Penn State Smeal College of Business Board of Visitors from 2006-2013 and chaired the community with distinction committee. From 2006 to 2007, he was an Executive Fellow at the Institute for Defense and Business Chapel Hill, NC.

From 2002 to 2005, Rick was Deputy Commandant for Installations and Logistics, U. S. Marine Corps. He was responsible for the leadership, management, and modernization of global logistics and supply chain; infrastructure and real estate; land use and environmental stewardship; e-business and contracting; and small business. During this period he provided oversight of the full range of logistics support to 200,000 Marines and Sailors at home stations and around the world engaged in two major combat operations. From 2000 to 2002, Rick was Vice Director for Logistics for the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Rick enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1970 as an infantryman and transitioned to logistics in the mid-1970s. During his 35-year career, he served in a wide range of logistics, supply chain, and infrastructure management positions to include six commands and over eight years as a general officer.

Rick's academic degrees include an MBA from Pepperdine University, a B.A. in economics and business administration from Chapman University, and a B.A. in history from Penn State University. Rick is a graduate, with distinction, of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces.

Rick is on the board of directors of the Endangered Species Coalition and is a life member of the Sierra Club. At their small, urban Arlington Virginia home, he and his wife have created a garden environment that promotes the use of native plants and provides habitat for birds, butterflies, and small critters of which they are avid observers. Rick is a passionate mountain biker, skier, diver, hiker, and eco-traveler who loves all things out-of-doors. He is a member MORE, the mid-Atlantic mountain bike advocacy group, and is active in trail building.

In 2010, Rick established the Kelly Family Scholarship Fund at his alma mater, Pittsburgh Central Catholic High School. The fund assists financially disadvantaged minority students who would not otherwise be able to pursue a quality education. In 2005, Rick was designated a Distinguished Alumni by the Penn State Board of Trustees. In 2003, he was inducted into the Pittsburgh Central Catholic High School Hall of Fame.
